SECTION 1: MONTHLY OVERVIEW - VOLUME 1 - WHITE CASTLES



Theme Story Snapshot

Step into a peaceful winter wonderland with White Castles. This month, the classroom transforms into a snowy kingdom filled with glowing castles, gentle snowfalls, moonlit skies, and quiet winter magic. Children explore this world alongside our White Castles characters — Elin the Watcher, Rowan the Builder, Theo the Helper, Mira the Guide, and Lila the Dreamer — who model curiosity, kindness, teamwork, and imagination. Through dramatic play, cozy stories, and hands-on exploration, children slow down, notice details, build together, and discover that even in the quiet of winter, big learning is happening. The environment feels calm, magical, and inviting, with soft blues and whites, twinkling lights, winter textures, and spaces that encourage wonder, conversation, and creative play.

- Snowy castle dramatic play setup
- Winter character stories woven into circle time

Who This Month Is For

Designed for children ages 2-5, with a full infant and young toddler adaptation section included. All activities, stories, and experiences can be simplified so mixed-age programs can enjoy the same theme together.

Learning Focus This Month - This month intentionally supports all major early learning domains through play-based, hands-on experiences. Learning goals are purposeful, but should always delivered in flexible, developmentally appropriate ways.

- Literacy & Language – winter vocabulary, storytelling, conversation, and books
- Early Math – counting, comparing, shapes, and sorting in meaningful play
- Social-Emotional Learning – kindness, cooperation, patience, confidence, & empathy through character stories
- Science & Discovery – ice, snow, melting, temperature, and cause & effect
- Physical Development – daily gross motor movement and fine motor practice
- Creative Expression – art, music, dramatic play, and imagination

- Colors: White & Ice Blue







SECTION 4: CURRICULUM CHARACTERS & STORIES - VOLUME 1 - WHITE CASTLES

Mira loves showing friends the way through the snowy White Castle. She points out paths, helps others find what they need, and gently encourages friends when they feel unsure. Mira teaches children that being a guide means caring about others and helping them feel confident to try new things.



MIRA – THE GUIDE

⦿ Mira teaches us to:

- Help friends find their way
- Speak kindly and give encouragement
- Take turns leading and following
- Try new things with confidence
- Use our words to support others

⦿ When to use Mira in your day:

Circle time when introducing new activities or ideas

Transitions that need calm direction, like moving to centers

Small groups when children need guidance or reassurance

Dramatic play in the White Castle village

Any moment when a child is helping another feel brave



⦿ Teacher Prompt:

"Mira is guiding her friends today. How can we help someone who feels unsure? What could we say to be encouraging?"

⦿ Social-Emotional Focus:

Confidence • Encouragement • Leadership • Kindness

⦿ Try this with Mira:

Let one child be the "guide" during a simple activity, like leading friends to a center or showing how to start a game. Talk about how guides use kind words and how it feels to help others feel safe and confident.





SECTION 7: DAILY LESSON PLAN - VOLUME 1 - WHITE CASTLES

Week 1 – Monday - Theme: Welcome to the White Castles

CIRCLE TIME

Teacher:

"Friends, today we are stepping into a brand new winter world called the White Castles. In this snowy place, there are tall icy towers, quiet falling snow, and magical friends who live there. This month, we are going to explore their world and learn with them every day."

Introduce the characters one at a time (show images):

"**This is Elin the Watcher.** Elin helps us slow down and notice the snow and tiny details."

"**This is Theo the Helper.** Theo shows us how to help our friends and work together."

"**This is Rowan the Builder.** Rowan loves to build castles and try again when things fall."

"**This is Mira the Guide.** Mira helps show the way and encourages us when things feel new."

"**And this is Lila the Dreamer.** Lila imagines stories and magical adventures in the castles."

Teacher:

"These friends will be with us all month in our stories, games, and play."

Introduce focus: "Today our letter is A, our number is 1, the shape is a circle, and our color is white, just like snow!"

Song/Chant: "To the tune of 'Row, Row, Row Your Boat':

Snow, snow, soft and white,

Falling all around,

In our castles big and bright,

Friends and fun we've found!"

Quick Movement:

Stand and pretend to be snowflakes drifting down, then stretch tall like castle towers.

Character Moment:

"Which character do you want to be today? A watcher like Elin? A helper like Theo?"

LITERACY FOCUS – Letter A

Skill: Recognize letter A and its sound

Teacher: "This is letter A. A says /a/ like apples

Children trace A in the air and find A cards or posters.

MATH FOCUS – Number 1

Skill: Count and recognize one

Teacher: "Our number today is 1. Let's count one castle together."

Children hold up one finger and count one block or picture.

ACTIVITY / LEARNING GAME – PHYSICAL ANCHOR

Game: Carry One Block to the Castle

Materials: Blocks, Magnatiles, or recycled boxes

Setup: A bin on one side, "castle spot" on the other

How to Play: Children carry one block at a time to build one group castle.

Movement: Walking, bending, carrying, stacking.

Extension:

Work in pairs — one carries, one stacks.

CRAFT – White Castle Collage

Materials: Paper, glue, cotton balls or torn white paper, markers

Instructions: Print a black and white castle and let the children glue blue/white ripped paper onto the castle. They can also use cotton balls for snow.

Fine Motor: Pinching, gluing, placing.

SENSORY / STEM – Snow Touch Tray

Materials: Cotton balls, shredded paper, scoops, cups, small figures

Invitation: "Explore the snow. How does it feel? Can you hide a character?"

Guide language: soft, light, cold, white.

Outdoor Option:

Use real snow if available or make your own pretend snow - To make it, mix about three cups of baking soda with half to one cup of white shaving cream, adding the shaving cream slowly until the mixture becomes fluffy and moldable.

SNACK

Apple slices with a little cream cheese "snow spread", and blue sprinkles.

DAILY CLOSER

Teacher: "Today we met our White Castle friends and started our White Castle adventure. We learned about letter A, number 1, and the color white."

Reflection Question: "Which character do you like best so far?" Who likes to play in the snow?

INFANT & TODDLER ADAPTATION - NEVER LEAVE AN INFANT OR TODDLER ALONE OR UNATTENDED WITH ANY ITEM THAT IS NOT AGE APPROPRIATE. AGE APPROPRIATE MATERIALS ONLY - SAFETY FIRST

- Soft white fabrics and cotton to touch
- Point to character pictures and name them
- Stack one soft block together
- Say "A, A, A" during play
- Short, calm interactions focused on looking and listening

SECTION 10: CRAFT SHOWCASE - VOLUME 1 - WHITE CASTLES



Magical Winter Creations

These featured crafts invite children to create the snowy world of the White Castles using texture, sparkle, and big materials. Each craft is designed to be process-focused, photo-worthy, and full of winter magic.

Papier-Mâché Snowy Castle Towers

Materials:

Newspaper strips
Flour and water (paste)
Crumpled paper balls, paper bowls, or cardboard tubes (for shape)
Bowls
White and light blue paint
Paintbrushes
Optional: silver glitter, snowflake stickers

Instructions:

1. Mix flour and water to make a smooth paste.
2. Shape crumpled paper into balls or towers, or turn bowls upside down.
3. Dip newspaper strips into paste and layer over shapes.
4. Let dry completely (overnight or longer).
5. Paint white and ice blue to look like snowy castle towers.
6. Add glitter or stickers for sparkle.

Salt Watercolor Snowflakes

Materials:

White cardstock
Glue bottles
Salt
Watercolor paints
Paintbrushes
Trays or newspaper



Instructions:

1. Children draw snowflake designs with glue on paper.
2. Sprinkle salt over glue while still wet. Shake off extra.
3. Use watercolor paint to gently touch the salt.
4. Watch colors spread and sparkle.
5. Let dry completely.

Recycled Box White Castles Bricks

Materials:

Recycled boxes
White and blue paint
Sponges or paintbrushes
Paper circles for windows
Glue or tape
Optional: foil, cotton, glitter



Instructions:

1. Stack and tape boxes to form castle shapes.
2. Paint boxes white and ice blue.
3. Glue on paper circles as castle windows.
4. Add foil for shine and cotton for snow.
5. Let dry and use in dramatic play.



Display & Celebrate

- Create a White Castles Gallery with snowflakes and towers hanging overhead.
- Use recycled castles in dramatic play.
- Take photos for families and portfolios.
- Let children describe their creations during circle time.

Teacher Tip

Talk about textures and colors: soft, bumpy, smooth, white, icy blue. Connect to characters: build like Rowan, dream like Lila, watch like Elin.

Safety Note

All materials must be age appropriate and used with close supervision. Put away supplies, salt, small pieces, and wet or messy materials if complete supervision is not possible.

These crafts bring the White Castles to life through big art, real texture, and winter wonder.

What We Are Learning

White Castles – A Winter of Wonder

This month, our classroom is transformed into a magical winter world of snowy castles, glowing windows, and gentle winter adventures. Through stories, play, and hands-on activities, children are exploring early literacy, math, science, and social skills in a calm and imaginative environment.

Literacy:

We are focusing on the letters A & B, practicing recognition, sounds, and beginning writing through games, stories, and simple worksheets.

Math:

Children are learning numbers 1 & 2, counting objects, and exploring the shape circle through movement and play.

Science & Discovery:

We are investigating snow, ice, light, shadows, and winter textures through sensory bins, simple STEM activities, and observation.

Social-Emotional Learning:

Our monthly characters help guide learning:

- **Elin** teaches children to slow down, notice details, and be aware of the world around them.
- **Rowan** encourages children to try again, build, and solve problems without giving up.
- **Theo** shows how helping others and sharing makes our classroom kinder and stronger.
- **Mira** helps children learn to guide, encourage, and lead with confidence and kindness.
- **Lila** inspires imagination, creativity, and sharing ideas and stories.

Children are learning to work together, express ideas, and build confidence through play.

Reminders

- Please send your child in warm layers for winter-themed activities and movement.
- Check backpacks daily for artwork and notes.
- If your child is out, feel free to ask for missed activities or updates.
- Let us know if your child has any winter sensitivities (cold hands, dry skin, etc.).

TEACHER DISCUSSION QUESTIONS: WHITE CASTLES

What are "White Castles"?

Talk about snowy castles and winter places where everything looks white and icy.

Ask: What do you think a white castle looks like? What might be inside?

Teacher-guided answer: A white castle could be made of snow or ice, with glowing windows, towers, and bridges.

What do you notice about winter?

Help children observe the winter season.

Ask: How does winter feel? What do you see outside in winter?

Teacher-guided answer: Winter can feel cold. We might see snow, ice, bare trees, clouds, and gray or blue skies.

How do people stay warm in winter?

Encourage practical thinking and self-care.

Ask: What do you wear when it is cold? What helps you stay warm?

Teacher-guided answer: Coats, hats, gloves, scarves, warm drinks, blankets, and staying inside help us stay warm.

What do you think life would be like in a snowy castle?

Spark imagination and storytelling.

Ask: What would you do if you lived in a castle made of snow?

Teacher-guided answer: We might build towers, slide on ice, look out glowing windows, and help each other stay warm.

How can we be helpers in our castle?

Connect to social-emotional learning and Theo the Helper.

Ask: How can you help friends in our classroom?

Teacher-guided answer: We can share, clean up, help someone who falls, and use kind words.

What does it mean to build something strong?

Connect to Rowan the Builder.

Ask: What makes a building strong? What can we do if it falls?

Teacher-guided answer: Strong buildings have wide bases, stacked blocks, and builders who try again if it falls.

Why is it important to watch and notice?

Connect to Elin the Watcher.

Ask: What can you learn by looking closely?

Teacher-guided answer: We can see colors, shapes, patterns, and changes when we watch carefully.

How does a guide help us?

Connect to Mira the Guide.

Ask: When do you follow a guide? Who guides you at school?

Teacher-guided answer: A guide shows the way, helps us stay safe, and teaches us what to do next.

What shapes and colors do we see in our castles?

Reinforce academics.

Ask: Can you find circles? Do you see white or ice blue?

Teacher-guided answer: Circles can be windows and paths. White and ice blue remind us of snow and ice.

What have we learned about winter and ice?

Build science language.

Ask: What happens to ice when it gets warm? What does cold do?

Teacher-guided answer: Ice melts when warm. Cold makes water freeze. Winter changes how things feel and look.

What is your favorite part of the White Castles?

Encourage reflection and language.

Ask: What did you like most this month?

Teacher-guided answer: Children share their favorite activities, stories, or characters.

How can we show kindness in our classroom castle?

Wrap up with SEL.

Ask: What can you do today to be kind?

Teacher-guided answer: Kind words, helping hands, sharing, and gentle actions show kindness.
